	<b>PASSOVER</b> (15 Nisan) - Eight-day observance (seven in Israel) commemorating the Exodus from Egypt and the liberation of the Israelites from slavery. The first two and last two days (in Israel, the first and seventh days) are full holidays. The intermediate days, 'Hol Hamoed,' are half holidays. Matzah, unleavened bread, is eaten during the entire holiday period.		<b>ויקרא</b> Leviticus (Greek: <i>Λευιτικός</i> , "relating to the Levites") or <b>Vayikra</b> (Hebrew: <i>וַיִּקְרָא</i> , literally "and He called") is the third book of the Hebrew Bible, and the third of five books of the Torah/Pentateuch.

**PESACH**  
*In the first month, on the fourteenth day of the month, between sundown and complete darkness, comes Pesach for ADONAI. On the fifteenth day of the same month is the festival of matzah;*

*for seven days you are to eat matzah. On the first day you are to have a holy convocation; don't do any kind of ordinary work. Bring an offering made by fire to ADONAI for seven days. On the seventh day is a holy convocation; do not do any kind of ordinary work. Vayikra/Leviticus 23:5-8*

**PASSOVER** commemorates the night when death "passed over" the houses of the children of Israel because of the blood of the lamb--the Passover lamb. It is a powerful picture of redemption through Yeshua/Jesus, the Passover lamb of God. And so, as in faith, the Israelites applied the blood of the lamb to the doorposts of their homes, so must we, in faith, apply the blood of Yeshua to the doorposts of our hearts. **For our Pesach lamb, the Messiah, has been sacrificed.**



**מנורה**  
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\* **THE LORD JESUS CHRIST—YESHUA HAMASHIAKH**, having fulfilled the type of the Passover lamb at Calvary, when the corn of wheat was planted in the ground, rose from the dead and became the "first fruits," fulfilling the type of the wave sheaf on the "day after the Sabbath." Meaning the 15th of Nisan, between end of 15 Nisan and 16 Nisan, note Biblical days start at evening.

**שבת BIBLICAL SABBATH**, day of holiness and rest observed by Jews from sunset on Friday to nightfall of the following day. The time division follows the biblical story of creation: "And there was evening and there was morning, one day" (Genesis 1:5). **Weekly observance** begins with candle lighting Friday evening before sunset & ends Saturday at nightfall. In Jewish homes the woman of the house lights white Sabbath candles before sunset on Friday evening and pronounces a benediction. The Sabbath meal that follows is preceded by the Kiddush (blessing of sanctification). **SHABBAT SHALOM!**
