The time division follows the biblical story of creation: "And there was evening and there was morning, one day" (Genesis 1:5). Observance begins with candle lighting Friday evening before sunset & ends Saturday at nightfall. In Jewish homes the woman of the house lights white Sabbath candles before sunset on Friday evening and pronounces a benediction. The Sabbath meal that follows is preced- ed by the Kiddush. (blessing of sanctification). SHABBAT SHALOM <i>Blessed are you ADONAI our God, King of the Universe who sancti- fied us by your Word, & commanded us to be a light for the nations & gave us YESHUA /Jesus our Messiah, the light of the world.</i>		
Our Tragic Mistake The ritual of TASHLIKH is performed on the after- noon of the first day of Rosh Hashanah by a lot of Jews. Prayers are recited near natural flowing water, and one's sins are symbolically cast into the water. Many also have the custom to throw bread or pebbles into the water, to symbolize the "casting off" of sins.
